- Tiger is our mascot at the Nebraska School for the Deaf (NSD). Our colors are orange and black.
- 2. Tigers have unique striped patterns, with none identical to others.
- 3. Tigers are among the largest cat species, weighing up to 570 pounds and reaching lengths of 10 feet.
- Tigers are excellent swimmers and can swim at speeds up to 38 miles per hour.



- 5. Tigers are fast runners. They can sprint up to 40 miles per hour for short distances.

- 7. Tigers can live up to 25 years, while in the wild, it's typically 18-20 years.

- 9. Tigers' roars are incredibly loud, reaching up to 114 decibels, which is comparable to a chainsaw or a jet airplane taking off. It can be heard up to two miles away.
- 10. Tigers have the longest canine teeth of any living cat, up to 4 inches long.
- 11. Tigers live mainly in the forests of tropical Asia, though they also roam colder climates like those in Northeast Asia.
- 12. Tigers' urine smells like buttered popcorn.
  Don't get tempted because it also signifies a warning sign to the intruders in their territory.
- 13. The tiger population has declined by 97% over the last century. Their decline is largely attributed to poaching, although habitat loss plays a major role, too.
- 14. Tigers are carnivores, eating only meat. They are solitary hunters and generally search for food alone at night.
- 15. Tigers will always be NSD's mascot and in our hearts. Long live the TIGERS!
